



HOME-SCHOOL AGREEMENT POLICY

This version applies to boarder pupils in Years 7 to 11

The Parents shall:

- make every effort to ensure that my child arrives at the designated time at the beginning of a new session or after a weekend Exeat and that she/he is properly equipped;
- make every effort to ensure that my child leaves school at the designated time at the end of a session or for a weekend Exeat;
- support the Christian Foundation of the School including the requirement for my child to attend Sunday Chapel as indicated in the termly calendar;
- let the School and Boarding House staff know about any concerns or problems, including health problems, that might affect my child's work or behaviour;
- support the School's Discipline Policy and the specific Boarding regulations
- support my child in homework and other opportunities for home learning when she/he is at home;
- when possible, attend Parents' Evenings and discussions about my child's progress.

The School and Boarding House will

- provide challenging educational experiences, in a safe, caring and orderly environment, which encourage pupils to realise their full potential;
- contact Parents if there is a problem with attendance, Chapel attendance, punctuality, behaviour or equipment;
- let Parents know about any concerns or problems, including health problems, that affect their child's work or behaviour;
- monitor your child's effort through half-termly tutor cards and provide an annual report on your child's progress as well as a twice yearly report on your child's progress in boarding;
- set and monitor homework in accordance with the School's homework policy; arrange Parents' Evenings during which your child's progress will be discussed;
- keep Parents informed about School activities through a termly calendar, termly newsletter and notices about special events;
- provide opportunities for Parents to contribute to the life of the School and welcome their presence in Sunday Chapel.

The Pupil shall:

- attend school and Chapel regularly and on time;
- be polite and helpful to others;
- help to make the school and Boarding House orderly and caring places;
- do all my work, including homework, as well as I can;

- bring all the equipment I need every day;
- wear the school uniform and be tidy in appearance;
- comply with the school's anti-bullying and discipline policies;
- support and become involved in School and House events;
- keep the school free from litter and graffiti;
- recognise that Day School rules apply during school hours and Boarding House rules apply at other times.
