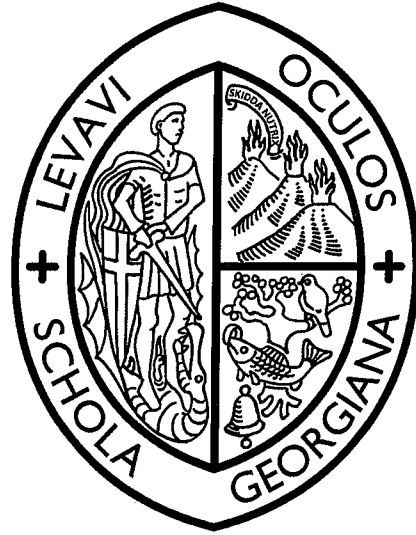

Remember that the Exams Office is here to help you with any questions you may have. We are generally open from 08.30 until 16.30 from Monday to Thursday, and 08.30 until 16.00 on Friday during term time, and operate similar hours during most holidays. N.B. Certain documents in this booklet, marked \* in the contents, were designed to be viewed in colour using a consistent code for the different year groups. Pink is for Year 11, green for Year 12 and blue for year 13. Paperwork issued to students is in these same colours.

## Advice to students at St George's sitting External Exams

- Learn your candidate number (shown on your Statement of Entry). You will need it for all exams, including orals.
- Be certain you understand your timetable, and know when and where you are supposed to be for each paper. Your personal timetable will show the venue and seat number, and you **must** know this information. It is also displayed on the board outside the Exams Office from after lunchtime of the day before.
- Times shown are always **starting** times. You should aim to arrive at the correct venue at least 15 minutes before this.
- If you are ill on the day of an exam, and unable to attend, please contact the Exams Office as early as possible (see numbers below). Obtain a medical certificate so that we can apply for special consideration.
- If you think you are going to be late for an exam for whatever reason, again let the Exams Office know, so arrangements can be made. Note that you will not normally be admitted to an exam if you arrive more than 30 minutes late.
- Ensure you have read the JCQ notes on controlled assessment, coursework and conduct in the exam room (in the appendix of this hand book). In particular, make sure you do not have any mobile phone, MP3 player or the like on your person **or in a bag in the exam room**. These **MUST** be switched off and handed to an invigilator. Please note that while we will take all reasonable care to look after such items, we will not take any responsibility for loss or damage. Anything handed in should be clearly labelled. We are obliged to report to the exam board any example of a mobile phone or similar going off, even whilst not on the student's person and can lead to very serious consequences. PLEASE take this rule very seriously.
- Students must enter the exam room in **SILENCE** and there must be no communication with any other student until outside the exam room. This includes turning round or trying to attract the attention of another student in any way. If there are any questions you must raise your hand and wait for an invigilator to come to you.
- Please note that any breach of exam rules would lead to serious disciplinary action by the school, in addition to any action taken by the board.
- Please bring any equipment you may need for the exam (ruler, calculator, **spare pen** etc) with you, in a **clear** pencil case. We cannot promise to provide such equipment, and you are not allowed to borrow from another candidate. You may not bring any food or drink into the exam room except water in an unlabelled bottle.
- Do **NOT** use correcting fluid or tape of any kind. **DO** write in **BLACK** ink. This is because more and more papers are scanned and marked on screen. You may lose marks if your answers cannot be read easily.

## **ABSENCE**

Absence from an exam should always be reported at the earliest opportunity, and in the case of illness a medical note should be obtained. In some cases it may still be possible to obtain a grade for the subject by applying for Special Consideration, but only where the candidate has already taken enough other papers and/or coursework. Advice should be sought from the Exams Office as soon as possible.

Please note that where a candidate fails to sit an exam without good reason, there will be a £20 fee to withdraw their entry.

## **ACCESS ARRANGEMENTS**

Some students are entitled to Access Arrangements. These arrangements are made in conjunction with the Learning Support Department, except in the case of a last minute problem e.g. a hand injury close to the date of the exam necessitating a scribe. All candidates with Access Arrangements will receive a letter from the Exams Office setting out the details of their entitlement. Please note that students with Access Arrangements will normally sit their exams in a separate venue, except where a very small number of candidates are involved.

The following are some of the most common Access Arrangements available:

- Extra time, usually of 13 or 25%
- Supervised rest breaks
- Use of a reader and/or scribe
- Use of an exam office netbook in some or all subjects

In all cases the Exam Boards lay down very strict criteria for the granting of any Access Arrangements. Within the Learning Support department there is a Specialist Assessment team who will carry out the necessary testing. Students who are tested will not necessarily qualify for Access Arrangements. It is important to note that it is the Exam Boards who make the decision based on the evidence available.

Some students may also qualify for Access Arrangements on medical or psychological grounds. In these cases supporting evidence will always be required from a suitably qualified medical professional, and it is important to notify the Learning Support Department or Exams Office as early as possible. Again, the final decision rests with the Exam Boards.

For students who qualify for a reader and/or scribe we use Teaching Assistants and teachers from Learning Support who have been given extra training in the rules surrounding the respective Access Arrangements.

## **CERTIFICATES**

Certificates for summer exams usually become available in October or November. Where we post these out, we are obliged to do so using a card-backed envelope and recorded delivery, so charge £5 to cover expenses. Year 13 will have been asked to pay this to the Exams Office before they leave school, and those who have done so will receive their certificates automatically. Those who have not done so, and those in any other year who are no longer students of the school will be notified when they are available and given the option of sending in the postage costs or collecting them. Certificates not collected within one year of issue are shredded, as required by the exam boards.

Students still at the school will be asked to come to the Exams Office to sign for them.

Please note that exam certificates are very important documents which will often be required in later life, and should be looked after carefully. The exam boards no longer issue duplicates and a set of certified statements of results for both GCSE and GCE will cost over £200.

## **CONSORTIUM**

Certain students may study for one or more subjects at Roundwood Park or Sir John Lawes. Any units involving coursework or a practical element will usually be sat at the host school; all other units will be taken at St George's. Please note that for any units where you are entered at the other school you will have a different exam number and receive a separate statement of entry from them. We would always suggest that you check with us to ensure you are correctly entered.

## **CONTROLLED ASSESSMENT (GCSE) AND COURSEWORK (GCE)**

Please ensure that you read the appropriate notices from JCQ contained in the appendices. In particular it is important to note that Controlled Assessment in class must be completed under the same conditions as a written exam (see the JCQ Warning to Candidates, also in the appendices). The school will impose penalties where necessary on any student who flouts these regulations.

## **DEADLINES**

You are no doubt used to teachers setting you deadlines. Please note that those set by the Exam Boards are absolute. In other words if you are one day late in making an entry or changing a tier in a subject it will cost you money! As examples, a retake of a GCE unit typically costs about £20; this rises to £60 the nearer you are to the exam. Changing a tier of entry at GCSE costs nothing if you do it early enough: later on it can cost £70 or more. Please notice the dates we give you and keep to them.

## **INVIGILATORS**

For external exams, Year 11 grade predictor exams in December and Year 10 school exams in May you will be supervised by external invigilators. Their job is to ensure the smooth running of the exams and that the procedures laid down by the exam boards are followed. If they ask you to do, or not to do something, then you should treat the request in the same way as if it had come from any other member of staff. They are not allowed to help you with the questions or spell words for you, so please don't ask. Nor will they always have enough spare pens and other equipment for everyone who needs it, so bring your own!

## **MALPRACTICE**

Any breach of the rules for conduct of the exams (please see the JCQ notices in the appendices) is classified as malpractice, and the school is obliged to submit a report to the appropriate exam board, who will decide the penalty to apply. These penalties can be severe, so please ensure that you understand the rules.

## **PERSONAL TIMETABLES**

Personal Timetables are issued to all students sitting exams (external and internal) well beforehand, showing the venue and seat number for each paper. This information is also displayed outside the Exams Office from the day before. An example is included in the appendices.

Please note that when 2 or more exams in the same subject are timetabled at the same time and in the same session (as shown on the Statement of Entry), they will actually run consecutively and the Personal Timetable will show the correct start time for each paper. If 2 or more exams in **different** subjects are timetabled in this way, this is a clash which will necessitate moving one or more of the papers to a different time. Again, the arrangements made to resolve the clash will show on the Personal Timetable.

## **POST RESULTS**

All students receive a pack with their results outlining the possibilities for retakes, remarks and obtaining scripts. The dates for applying for any of these services are included in The Examination Year 2011 -2012 in the appendix and on the website.

## **RESULTS**

Results from January entries will be issued on the 8<sup>th</sup> of March. Summer GCE results will be available on the 16<sup>th</sup> August, and those for GCSE on the 23<sup>rd</sup>. Details of timings and how to obtain results will be issued well beforehand.

## **SPECIAL CONSIDERATION**

We can apply for special consideration for a candidate where illness or other crisis very close to the date of the exam may have prevented him or her from giving of his or her best. We would point out that the maximum enhancement available is 5% of the marks obtained (**not** the marks available for the paper), and that this would only be in the most serious case. 1 or 2% would be more typical, for example, when sitting an exam while unwell.

See also absence.

## **STATEMENTS OF ENTRY**

A Statement of Entry is one of the most important documents you will receive in the run up to the exams. It will usually be issued in a Friday 5 meeting, typically in October for January entries, in January for summer GCSE entries and in March for summer GCE entries. It is **essential** that the information on it is 100% correct. You will be asked to check the Statement carefully at home, and notes will be issued to help you do this. Any mistakes reported within a week of issue will be corrected free of charge, but after this a sliding scale of charges will apply (see also Deadlines). An example Statement of Entry appears in the appendices.

## **TIMETABLE**

An updated version of the total exam timetable, which appears in the appendices, can be found on the VLE and the school website. This can be used to get an idea of when your exams will be before personal timetables are issued.

## Warning to Candidates

1. You **must** be on time for all your examinations.
2. You **must not** become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice in any part of the examination.
3. You **must not**:
  - sit an examination in the name of another candidate;
  - have in your possession any unauthorised material or equipment which might give you an unfair advantage.
4. **Possession of a mobile phone** or other unauthorised material **is breaking the rules**, even if you do not intend to use it, and you will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification.
5. You **must not** talk to, attempt to communicate with or disturb other candidates once you have entered the examination room.
6. You **must** follow the instructions of the invigilator.
7. If you are in any doubt speak to the invigilator.

**The *Warning to Candidates* must be displayed in a prominent place outside each examination room. This may be a hard copy A3 paper version or an image of the poster projected onto a wall or screen for all candidates to see.**

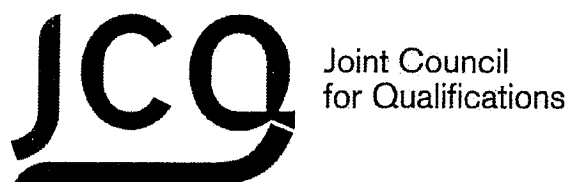

**Information for candidates**  
**For written examinations – effective from 1 September 2011**

**This document has been written to help you. Read it carefully and follow the instructions.**  
**If there is anything you do not understand, especially which calculator you may use, ask your teacher.**

<b>A</b>	<b>Regulations – Make sure you understand the rules</b>
1	Be on time for all your exams. If you are late, your work might not be accepted.
2	Do not become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice during the exam.
3	If you try to cheat, or break the rules in any way, you could be disqualified from all your subjects.
4	You <b>must not</b> take into the exam room: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• notes;</li> <li>• calculator cases/instruction leaflets;</li> <li>• reading pens;</li> <li>• mobile phones, iPods, MP3/4 players or any other products with text/digital facilities.</li> </ul> <p><b>Any pencil cases taken into the exam room must be see-through.</b></p> <p><b>Remember:</b> possession of unauthorised material is breaking the rules, even if you do not intend to use it, and you will be subject to penalty and possible disqualification.</p>
5	Do not use correcting pens, fluid or tape, erasable pens, highlighters or gel pens in your answers.
6	Do not talk to or try to communicate with or disturb other candidates once the exam has started.
7	If you leave the exam room unaccompanied by an invigilator before the exam has finished, you will not be allowed to return.
8	Do not borrow anything from another candidate during the exam.
<b>B</b>	<b>Information – Make sure you attend your exams and bring what you need</b>
1	Know the dates and times of all your exams.
2	Arrive at least ten minutes before the start of each exam.
3	If you arrive late for an exam, report to the invigilator running the exam.
4	If you arrive more than one hour after the published starting time for the exam, you may not be allowed to take it.
5	Only take into the exam room the pens, pencils, erasers and any other equipment which you need for the exam.
6	You must write in black ink. Coloured pencils or inks may be used only for diagrams, maps, charts, etc. unless the instructions printed on the front of the question paper state otherwise.
<b>C</b>	<b>Calculators, Dictionaries and Computer Spell-checkers</b>
1	You may use a calculator unless you are told otherwise.
2	If you use a calculator <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• make sure it works properly; check that the batteries are working properly;</li> <li>• clear anything stored in it;</li> <li>• remove any parts such as cases, lids or covers which have printed instructions or formulas;</li> <li>• do not bring into the exam room any operating instructions or prepared programs.</li> </ul>
3	Do not use a dictionary or computer spell checker unless you are told otherwise.
<b>D</b>	<b>Instructions during the exam</b>
1	Listen to the invigilator and follow their instructions at all times.
2	Tell the invigilator at once: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• if you think you have not been given the right question paper or all of the materials listed on the front of the paper;</li> <li>• if the question paper is incomplete or badly printed.</li> </ul>
3	Read carefully and follow the instructions printed on the question paper and/or on the answer booklet.
4	Fill in all the details required on the front of the question paper and/or the answer booklet before you start the exam. Make sure you fill these details in on any additional answer sheets that you use.
5	Remember to write your answers within the designated sections of the answer booklet.
6	Do your rough work on the proper exam stationery. Cross it through and hand it in with your answers. Make sure you add your candidate details to any additional answer sheets that you use.
<b>E</b>	<b>Advice and assistance</b>
1	If on the day of the exam you feel that your work may be affected by ill health or any other reason, tell the invigilator.
2	Put up your hand during the exam if: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• you have a problem and are in doubt about what you should do;</li> <li>• you do not feel well;</li> <li>• you need more paper.</li> </ul>
3	You must not ask for, and will not be given, any explanation of the questions.
<b>F</b>	<b>At the end of the exam</b>
1	If you have used more than one answer booklet and/or any loose sheets of paper, place them in the correct order. Remember to fasten them together with a treasury tag before you leave. Make sure you add your candidate details to any additional answer sheets that you use.
2	Do not leave the exam room until told to do so by the invigilator.
3	Do not take from the exam room any stationery, this includes the question paper, answer booklets used or unused, rough work or any other materials provided for the exam.
<b>This information must be made available to all candidates in advance of their examination(s).</b> <b>It may be provided electronically to candidates or in hard copy paper format.</b>

**Information for candidates**

**GCSE, Functional Skills and Principal Learning, Controlled Assessments**

**This document tells you about some things that you must and must not do when you are completing your work.**

**Before you submit any work for marking, you will be asked to sign an authentication statement confirming that you have read and followed these regulations.**

If there is anything that you do not understand, you **must** ask your teacher or lecturer.

Controlled Assessment will provide you with an opportunity to do some independent research into a topic. The research you do may involve looking for information in published sources such as textbooks, encyclopedias, journals, TV, radio, and on the internet.

Using information from published sources (including the internet) as the basis for your assignment is a good way to demonstrate your knowledge and understanding of a subject, but you must take care how you use this material - you cannot copy it and claim it as your own work.

**The regulations state that:**

**"the work which you submit for assessment must be your own",**

**"you must not copy from someone else or allow another candidate to copy from you".**

If you use the same wording as a published source, you must place quotation marks around the passage and state where it came from. This is called "referencing". You must make sure that you give detailed references for everything in your work which is not in your own words. A reference from a printed book or journal should show the name of the author, the year of publication and the page number, for example: (Morrison, 2000, pg.29).

For material taken from the internet, your reference should show the date when the material was downloaded and must show the precise web page, not the search engine used to locate it. This can be copied from the address line. For example:

You may be required to include a bibliography at the end of your work. Your teacher or lecturer will tell you whether a bibliography is necessary. Where required, your bibliography must list the full details of publications you have used in your research, even where these are not directly referred to, for example: Morrison, A. (2000) "Mary, Queen of Scots", London: Weston Press.

**If you copy the words or ideas of others and don't show your sources in references and a bibliography, this will be considered as cheating.**

## **Preparing your work – good practice**

If you receive help and guidance from someone other than your teacher, you **must** tell your teacher who will then record the nature of the assistance given to you.

If you worked as part of a group on an assignment, for example, undertaking field research, you must each write up your own account of the assignment. Even if the data you have is the same, the description of how that data was obtained and the conclusions you draw from it should be in your own words.

You must meet the deadlines that your teacher gives you. Remember - your teachers are there to guide you. Although they cannot give you direct assistance, they can help you to sort out any problems before it is too late.

Take care of your work and keep it safe. Don't leave it lying around where your classmates can find it. You must always keep your work secure and confidential whilst you are preparing it; do not share it with your classmates. If it is stored on the computer network, keep your password secure. **Information for candidates**

**GCE, ELC and Project Qualifications, Coursework Assessments**

**This leaflet tells you about some things that you must, and must not do when you are completing coursework.**

**Before you submit any coursework for marking, you will be asked to sign an authentication statement confirming that you have read and followed these regulations.**

If there is anything that you do not understand, you **must** ask your teacher or lecturer.

Coursework provides you with an opportunity to do some independent research into a topic. The research you do will involve looking for information in published sources such as textbooks, encyclopedias, journals, TV, radio, and on the internet.

Using information from published sources (including the internet) as the basis for your coursework is a good way to demonstrate your knowledge and understanding of a subject, but you must take care how you use this material - you cannot copy it and claim it as your own work.

**The regulations state that:**

**"the work which you submit for assessment must be your own",**

**"you must not copy from someone else or allow another candidate to copy from you".**

If you use the same wording as a published source, you must place quotation marks around the passage and state where it came from. This is called "referencing". You must make sure that you give detailed references for everything in your work which is not in your own words.
