1 hour 15 minute exam 20% of A Level

Possible texts: 'Lady Audley's Secret', 'The Cutting Season'

Unit 3

**Poetry** Examination

Open Book Clean copy Two texts

One question on post-2000 poetry anthology; one on specific poet (centre's choice)

2 hour 15 minute exam 30% of A Level

**Possible text: C Rosetti** 

Unit 4

Coursework
Non Exam

2,500 - 3,000 essay

Comparison of two texts chosen by centre

20% of A Level

Possible texts: tbc
