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

St George's Art Results at A Level Are exceptional!

Art Dept Analysis A Level Results 2024

- 76% of students gained A/A* at A Level
- 89% of students gained grades A*-B at A Level
- 98% met or exceeded expectation.
- Nearly half added 2 or more grades VA.
- 62% of boys achieved a VA score of 2 or more grades.

The Art Department provided 43% of all A* grades achieved by Year 13s at St. George's and 16% of All A Grades



The arts make self starters and develop cultural and emotional intelligence...


Students set their own agenda/invent their own projects rather than follow set topics as in other subjects. They have to make independent decisions all the way, and be self-critical. They learn to present their creations, and accept criticism. Working in teams makes students into good communicators.





The arts are stretching

An Art A Level requires hard work and dedication. Students have to pay great attention to detail, to be resilient and refine work. Student's learn transferable skills when exhibition or concert takes strong organisational skills.



Arts students are sought-after by employers






Photography

Graphic Communication

Studying Graphic Communication will provide students with a diverse range of creative and technical design skills and solutions. This course will give you an understanding of the creative design process in its entirety, enabling you to tackle briefs with confidence and develop the practical skills needed to flourish in university or in a related field of work. Working independently, as a whole class or small groups, pairs. Lots of 1:1 discussions. Past example projects. Sharing of ideas with peers.
