#### **Instrumental Tuition: One to One**

St George's works in partnership with Musicale, a privately run Instrumental and Vocal lessons provider – whose premises are leased on the school site. The relationship is very positive, and the Music Department works in close co-ordination with the tutors of GCSE and A Level students (and their accompanists) to ensure the best outcomes in performance exams.

#### **Instruments offered:**

Strings: Violin, Viola, Cello, Guitars

Woodwind: Clarinet, Flute, Oboe, Saxophone, Bassoon Brass: Trumpet, Cornet, Tuba, Trombone, French Horn

Others: Piano, Drum-kit, Voice

Finance: Musicale lessons priced at £28.30 per 30mins (longer lessons available)

Scholarships: Douglas Dawn Memorial Scholarship (£200) annual for 1 student with aptitude

(Year 9) and Sir Halley Stewart Prize (£125) for singing tuition (Year 12)

**Pupil Premium:** Free hire of instrument from Music Department (saxophones, flute, clarinet, double bass, tuba)

### **Instrumental Tuition: Small Group**

St George's staff lead smaller tuition in the form of Clarinet Club, Improvisation Station (for saxophonists and brass) and Senior Students tutor a small group Y7-8 male singers.
