This is, indeed, a season where remembrance takes on a central role in our lives. Whether it is in honouring the saints and our departed loved ones on All Saints' and All Souls' Days, recalling "the 5th of November," or in the solemn commemoration of those who made the ultimate sacrifice on Remembrance Day, we are reminded of the weight of history.

Unpacking these events in school can lead to questions at home, but this is important as we remember so that we can move forwards. I was moved by the simple tribute in our chapel this week, where a Perspex figure and small plaque reminded pupils of the sacrifices made. I look forward to seeing many of you on Sunday for our act of remembrance in the chapel and at the town centre. On Monday, the whole school will come together to mark this moment.

Service Sunday 10th 9.30 a.m.

Our annual Remembrance Service focuses on remembering those OGs who fell in the First and Second World War and the stories around their sacrifice. Our service will be held at <u>9.30 a.m.</u> (instead of the normal 10.00 a.m.) and we aim to finish by 10.30 a.m. and encourage parents/carers and students to join with the other churches and uniformed organisations in the town at the memorial at 11.00 a.m. (after our service). Please ensure your child comes early for the service and is seated by <u>9.20 a.m.</u>. This is a serious and solemn service and therefore we will not let people come into chapel late! You are also welcome to join us in this special service.



Remembrance Service on Monday

Our senior students have been selling poppies all week and on Monday 11th November at 11.00 a.m. we will gather as a whole school in the MUGA for a joint Remembrance service, last post and reading of the names of the fallen. It is a very moving moment for everyone.

The library has displays of war-related books (fiction and nonfiction) to encourage students to learn more about war and how it impacts every one of all nations.


Year 7 Parents Evening Feedback Opportunity

Financial Assistance

Vaping and under 18-year-olds

- It is illegal to sell vapes containing nicotine to children under 18, or for adults to buy them on their behalf.
- Their developing lungs and brains mean they are more sensitive to its effects.
- Some cheap, illegal vapes may contain heavy metals and dangerous chemicals, and even illegal drugs.
- Lithium-ion batteries in vaping devices can overheat and explode, causing fires.
- If you find a retailer selling either nicotine vapes or tobacco products to under-18s, you can report them via the Citizens Advice online portal
