

Our Student Services Team plays a vital role in ensuring that every pupil receives the care and guidance they need to flourish — both personally and academically.

Working as House Pastoral Assistants (HPAs), our Student Services colleagues are an integral part of each House team. They provide an additional layer of support for pupils, working closely with Heads of House, Tutors, and teaching staff to ensure that every student has someone to turn to. Whether offering a listening ear, helping to navigate friendship challenges, or supporting pupils returning to school after a period of difficulty, their contribution is deeply valued.

Much of their time is spent in the Student Services area, where pupils can find a calm and supportive environment during the school day. It is a space designed for reflection and recovery; whether that means taking a short break, seeking practical help, or receiving emotional support. We also help students learn how to self-regulate so that they are able to return to lessons.

Changes to Holiday Food Vouchers Scheme for children receiving Free School Meals

Since December 2020, the Local Authority has issued food vouchers to eligible families, funded through various government schemes. From October 2021, this was supported by the **Household Support Fund**, a Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) initiative.

In the latest grant allocation (April 2025 – March 2026), Hertfordshire County Council received **12% less funding**, prompting a review of all programmes to ensure continued support for residents.

As part of **Household Support Fund 7**, vouchers will now be issued only during the main school holiday periods:

- Easter 2025 £30 per pupil
- May 2025 £15 per pupil
 - **Summer 2025** £60 per pupil
- Christmas 2025 £30 per pupil

We recognise that this change may have an impact on families, especially as the scheme has been in place for the past three years. For families requiring additional support, we recommend visiting this website: 'support with cost-of-living pages' on the Hertfordshire County Council website.

Banned Books Week (5-11th October)

This week we have been marking Banned Books Week in the library - an annual event that highlights the value of free and open access to information. It is a week to celebrate books that have been challenged, removed or silenced historically and/or currently in some countries.

Our fabulous display of banned books has attracted lots of interest and we have had some thought-provoking discussions on the reasons why particular books might have been banned. We ended with a quiz, providing an opportunity for students and staff to see whether their reasons were correct. Many were surprised to see that some of the most popular and well-loved titles in the library were on our Banned Books display. Rest assured, they are all still available to borrow from the library!

Please ensure your daughter has these items and remembers them for every practice or game. The school shop sells both of these items – gum shields especially can be purchased at lunchtimes should a student forget theirs. We no longer have items to loan as these have been depleted so unfortunately if your daughter attends training or a game without these items, they may be turned away for their own safety.

Our young people and staff have also been working hard and getting ready for our House Music finale, which is taking place on 21st October at Grove Theatre in Dunstable. It is looking to be an exciting evening as always, where our students showcase their musical talents with lively and friendly rivalry. It's not just about the competition, but also about building school spirit, fostering creativity, and bringing the school community together through the universal language of music. Important Safeguarding Notice: Children's "Spy" Books

We want to make you aware of a recent issue affecting some popular children's books by Andrew Cope, including the *Spy Dogs*, *Spy Cats*, and *Spy Pups* series.

Some editions of these books include a printed web address at the back. This link used to go to the author's website, but the domain is no longer under his control. It has since been taken over by another party and now leads to inappropriate adult content.

The publisher, Puffin, has paused sales and distribution of the books and is working with schools, libraries, and retailers to remove copies from circulation. They have stressed that the website has no connection to the author or publisher.

What this means for you:

- If your child has any *Spy Dog*, *Spy Cat* or *Spy Pups* books at home, please check the back for website links and make sure they do not try to visit the site.
- It is safe for children to continue reading the stories themselves the concern is only with the outdated link.
- We recommend talking with your child about the importance of not following web addresses in books without checking with an adult first.

Parking and Road Safety

We are concerned about the parking behaviours of a small minority of parents and carers. Unsafe and inconsiderate parking poses a risk to pedestrians (including many of our students) and other road users. It also negatively affects our relationship with neighbours and the wider community.

Specific concerns include:

- Narking on double yellow lines and "school keep clear" markings.
- Parking on pavements and across driveways.
- Stopping in the middle of the road to drop off or collect children.

If you need to drive your young person to/from school, please adopt a "Park and Stride" approach if possible. Two nearby public car parks are ideal for this:

- Lydekker Car Park (off Sun Lane)
- Bowers Way Car Parks

Rather than driving to the front of school, please consider dropping off a short distance away and encouraging your child to walk the rest of the way.
