To protect your child from being added to any future groups without their consent, please change their WhatsApp privacy settings:

- 1. Tap Settings
- 2. Tap Privacy then groups
- 3. Select 'My Contacts except ...'
- 4. Then select every single contact in their address book.

This ensures that no-one can add your child to any WhatsApp group without sending them a private invitation which they must choose to accept.
