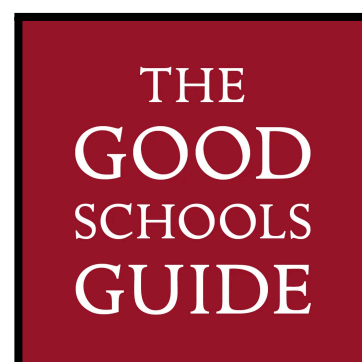


## From the Head

It is always encouraging when the work taking place at St. George's is recognised by those who come and spend time with us. Throughout the year we welcome a range of visitors who meet our pupils, observe our practice, and offer reflections on our school. Their insights are often a lovely reminder of the strength and character of our community.

Last week, we hosted The Good Schools Guide, who have now published their full review on their website. It is an excellent piece that captures the spirit of St. George's and celebrates the way we are aiming higher across so many aspects of school life.

I was particularly pleased that the reviewers highlighted the 'nurturing feel and warmth' of the school, recognising that our staff 'take a personal interest in the students doing well'. It was wonderful to read that our success is shaped by teachers 'who seem to really love teaching' and who 'have real passion for their subjects'.



The review also reflects the distinctive culture of St. George's, describing it as "such a warm, welcoming place" where "the ethos and values resonated". They highlighted the strength of our pastoral care, observing that the House system creates "a sense of identity and belonging far exceeding most state schools".

I am also very grateful to the parents who were interviewed. Your contributions clearly made an impression, with the Guide noting the enthusiasm with which you spoke about the school, and the shared sense that "there's real pride in St. George's being different".

Our pupils were, as they always are, outstanding representatives of the school. They were described as "polite, friendly and sparky", and it was particularly pleasing to read that they feel staff are "all on your side".

I will close with the final paragraph of the review, which sums up their experience of St. George's:

"You can't go wrong with any of Harpenden's state schools – and they all have a distinct offering. This is the 'traditional one', with its oldy-world building, tweed blazers, rugby, boarding and chapel all contributing to the more serious, heritage feel. Academically top of the pile too. Families couldn't be prouder of St. George's if they tried."

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## Careers in Science Talks

We were delighted to hold our first *Careers in Science* lunchtime talk today (27th November), and what a brilliant start it was. We welcomed Sarah O'Rourke, a high-dependency midwife, who spoke to pupils about her day-to-day role, the qualifications and training she completed, and how her work links to the science they study in school. The pupils were fascinated to hear how the biology they learn in the classroom plays such an important part in real-life medical care.

We had an amazing turnout of around 30 pupils, which is fantastic for our very first session. Thank you to everyone who came along with such enthusiasm and for also asking such great questions.

We can't wait to welcome pupils back over the next few weeks as we continue the series with more guest speakers. Pupils will need to sign up in advance, and early lunch passes are available for those attending. Everyone who comes along receives a badge and a punch card so we can keep track of how many talks they take part in; let's see how many they can collect!

We're really excited to bring in even more inspiring speakers and continue showing pupils the wide range of opportunities that science can lead to.



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## Future Economists Face the Big Questions in London

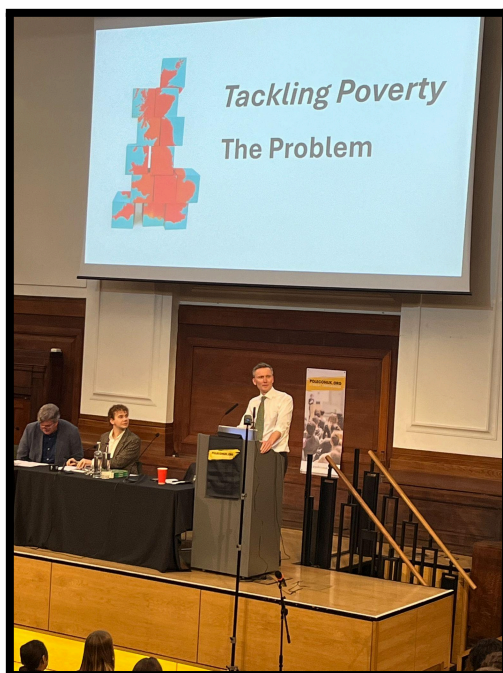
On Tuesday, twenty of our Economics students stepped into the heart of London for a major conference that brought theory to life in spectacular fashion.

The line-up of speakers was nothing short of impressive: Ed Balls—broadcaster, economist, former politician, and yes, *Strictly Come Dancing* star—alongside Torsten Bell MP, Hugh Pym (journalist and author), Stephen Flynn MP, and economist-author Vicky Price. Each delivered passionate insights into the state of the UK economy, unpacking last week's Budget decisions and offering bold projections for the future.

Discussions ranged far and wide: the political stance of the current Government; China's growing influence on global markets; the disruptive power of AI, and the ripple effects of seismic events—from the 2008 Financial Crisis to Brexit, the Pandemic, and the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war. For our students, it was a masterclass in connecting classroom theory with the real-world forces shaping economies today.

Perhaps the highlight? Watching our students confidently step up to the microphone, posing sharp questions to the panel in front of an audience of more than 1,000 people. Their curiosity and courage shone through.

Whether the day sparked a lifelong passion for economics and politics—or convinced a few that this world is best left to others—it was an unforgettable experience. A huge thank you to Mrs Potter and Mr Reynolds for running this exciting trip.

- Work collaboratively with families to complete assessments, identify needs, develop bespoke, outcome-focused support plans, and monitor progress in their home or school;
- Deliver evidence-based interventions and emotional well-being courses for children and parents/carers;
- Liaise effectively with a wide range of external professionals, including working closely with local schools, health, social care and voluntary organisations to ensure a coordinated, multi-agency approach to family support;
- Act as the lead professional on FFAs and in TAFs for a caseload of families, recognising potential safeguarding concerns and escalating them appropriately in line with local multi-agency safeguarding procedures.
- Maintain accurate, confidential case notes and ensure safeguarding is at the heart of your work;

The role will be based in our office at Sauncey Wood Primary school for 30 hours per week and the successful applicant will need to commit to occasional flexible working.
