The final week of term has been both busy and fulfilling, bringing together many of the elements that make life at St George's so amazing.

Last weekend saw a very well-attended Old Georgians' Carol Service, welcoming around 150 former pupils and friends of the school. These were followed on Sunday by two beautiful Senior Carol Services with outstanding contributions from both the Senior Choir and the Chamber Choir. These services provided moments of reflection, celebration and togetherness at the close of the year. Alongside this, we have seen the culmination of House Art, the final fixtures of the term, Christmas Lunch on Wednesday, and many smaller moments that together speak to the strength and warmth of our community.

This week's newsletter reflects the breadth of school life during this final part of term. 


From Classroom to Lab: AstraZeneca Director Ignites Students' Passion for Science Careers!

Last week, we were delighted to host our second *Careers in Science* talk, and it was a fantastic success. We welcomed Fernanda, a Commercial Director from AstraZeneca, who spoke to a group of 45 enthusiastic pupils from across the school. It was brilliant to see students from lower and upper years coming together to hear about real careers in the science world.

Fernanda gave us a fascinating insight into her role, explaining how no two days are ever the same and how there is, as she put it, *always something new and exciting to discover in science*. She works closely with a huge range of professionals—scientists, doctors, IT engineers, statisticians and even AI specialists—showing students just how many different pathways can lead into scientific work.

One of the messages that resonated most was that she didn't always know what she wanted to do. She encouraged pupils not to worry if they're still unsure about their future, reminding them that interests change and opportunities appear when you least expect them.

Students asked lots of thoughtful questions, and several even stayed behind afterwards to speak to her in more detail about her role and the wider pharmaceutical industry. Fernanda also shared that she is currently involved in work related to developing a weight-loss drug, which certainly caught everyone's attention!

A big thank you to all the pupils who attended—your curiosity and engagement made the session really special. Also, a massive thank you to our science technicians Mohinder and Karen for co-ordinating these talks. We look forward to welcoming more guests in our Careers in Science series later this year, as you collect 'hole punches' on your punch cards.



Co-Curricular Update
